COVID19: WHAT YOU MUST DO WHEN YOU ATTEND MASS:

- Register name and contact details on the list in the foyer (each person attending) every time you enter the church. This is a Government Regulation.
- It is not mandatory to wear a mask during Mass, however it is permissible for those who want to wear one.
- Use hand sanitiser before entering and leaving the church.
- Whilst seated in the Church keep 1.5 metres from everyone not in your household, including in the Communion Procession.
- Holy Communion should be received in the hand only. Holy Communion will be distributed from the Altar by Father & half way down the Church by a Eucharistic Minister. Procession in single file please.
- Bulletins are single use only. Do not leave on pew. Please take home or put in bin.
